Environmental Commitment

PWC is dedicated to minimising the environmental impact of our operations and projects. We aim to:

- 1. Integrate sustainable practices into all fieldwork, research, and administrative activities.
- 2. Prioritise the conservation and restoration of native ecosystems, including forests and endangered habitats.
- 3. Promote the use of renewable resources and reduce waste, emissions, and energy consumption.
- 4. Collaborate with partners who share our commitment to environmental stewardship.

Social Responsibility

We believe that conservation is only successful when it includes and uplifts local communities. We commit to:

- 1. Engage respectfully with Indigenous and rural communities and support their rights, knowledge, and leadership.
- 2. Promote education, health, and economic opportunities linked to conservation goals.
- 3. Ensure that all projects are designed and implemented with transparency, consent, and community participation.
- 4. Uphold principles of equity, inclusion, and safety for all people impacted by or involved in our work.

Governance and Accountability

This policy is overseen by the Board of Trustees and implemented by all members and partners. We regularly assess and improve our practices to uphold these commitments.
